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
The beaches and farms of eastern Long Island provide the foundation for Nancy Sandler Bass's aesthetic. By exploring landscape through the use of en Plein-air sketches, photographs, and memory, her work creates an intimate sense of place through images that are universally understood.

Elizabeth Bisbing has always been interested in the domestic as an underlying motif for her work. During this time of self isolation - she has returned 'home' once again. This body of work consists of drawings using pen or thin markers which create energy as the thin marks build up.

Multi-media artist Marykate O'Neil has released six albums, toured throughout the US and EU; her music has been played over the airwaves, the internets and has been featured in movies and television. Marykate's paintings are filled with sly- affectionate nods to the New York School, the Bay Area's figurative movement and pop art, while carving out a unique place for itself as a contemporary counterpart through her use of color, layers, texture and humor.

Clifford Thompson is a writer and artist whose paintings have appeared in online solo shows mounted by Artsy and Wagner College; in group shows at Blue Mountain Gallery; and on the covers of his books. His graphic novel, Big Man and the Little Men, combining his writing and artwork, will be published in the fall.

Pamela Tucker's work focuses on people: both individual portraits from life and multi-figure paintings inspired by group events. In each case, she abstracts recognizable imagery through geometric simplification, clear demarcations of tonal shifts and color intensity.
